Who: The Agricultural History Project would like to invite your class to experience some of the Agricultural History of the Central Coast of California through displays and hands-on activities at Yesterday's Farm. Students can read about what farm life was like first hand.



What: We currently have exhibits featuring grains and grinding, early dairy photos and artifacts, saddles and horse tack, farming equipment, buggies and wagons. Hands-on activities include:

- **Milking a "cow"**
- **Grinding corn**
- **Making Butter**
- **Playing an old fashioned game**
- **Hay wagon ride**
- **Pumping Water with a hand pump**
- **Washing clothes with a wash board**
- **A tour of the Codiga Center and Museum**



When: We offer two hour tours for school classes every Thursday and Friday beginning in October through the first two week of November and again in April and May 2007. The program is geared to third grade classes. Other classes will be accepted as space is available.
